### Washington Office Updates (Research and Development)

#### Kier Klepzig (for Randy Johnson, National Program Leader, Genetics and Global Change Research)

- Randy's office will be in the process of moving to the Rosslyn building during the next couple of weeks.
- The National Climate Assessment forest sector technical report was expected to be rolled out on 11/13. This will be available as a General Technical Report from the Pacific Northwest Research Station (GTR 870).
- USDA released a National Climate Assessment report on climate change effects and adaptation in agriculture on 11/13.

#### South Atlantic Landscape Conservation Cooperative (SALCC) Updates

- The South Atlantic LCC and other agencies and organizations shared methods for developing biological indicators during two biological objectives workshops. National Forest System Updates (cont'd)

- The Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest is working on climate change adaptation demonstration projects on every district. Similar projects are underway on the Bad River reservation and on Nature Conservancy land.
- The Green Mountain National Forest has included a climate change presentation in their all employee meetings. Atmospheric researcher Alan Betts (<a href="http://alanbetts.com/">http://alanbetts.com/</a>) was the guest speaker on climate change in Vermont.
- The Green and White Mountain National Forests met with NIACS to engage with Framework activities and will be reviewing available climate change impact/vulnerability assessments in the Northeast for application to adaptation activities.

#### David Meriwether, Ecosystems Management Coordinator, Southern Region

- The El Yunque, Francis Marion, and Nantahala-Pisgah National Forests are focused on Planning Rule implementation efforts, which are currently in the planning assessment phase with support from the Template for Assessing Climate Change Impacts and Management Options (TACCIMO).
- Scorecard reports show good progress with regard to employee education at the field level. Extra help is needed to address adaptation, so regional plans are focused on adaptation actions and identifying monitoring needs.
