- NRS scientists Rich Birdsey and Randy Kolka organized a session on tropical forest wetland carbon stocks and greenhouse gas emissions for the International Union of Forest Research Organizations World Congress.
- NRS research ecologist Brian Palik and others will present silvicultural solutions to increase resistance and resilience to drought at the Society of American Foresters National Convention.

# **National Forest System Updates**

#### Leslie Brandt, Climate Change Specialist (Northern Institute of Applied Climate Science, NIACS), Eastern Region

- The <u>Performance Scorecard</u> regional summary report has been completed. Several elements have improved, including adaptation actions and program guidance.
- The Huron-Manistee National Forests are partnering with Project Budburst on monitoring efforts.
- The forest ecosystem vulnerability assessment and synthesis for northern Wisconsin and western Upper Michigan is available as a General Technical Report.
- The *Journal of Forestry* has published "A practical approach for translating climate change adaptation principles into forest management actions" (Janowiak et al.).
- About 90 people participated in a <u>Forest Adaptation Planning and Practices training session</u> in Amherst, MA last month. Training will be held in <u>Brunswick</u>, ME, <u>December 8-10</u> and tentatively in Marion, IL, January 21-22.
- NRS climate change specialist Stephen Handler will offer adaptation training at the upcoming Shifting Seasons Summit.
- NIACS is co-sponsoring an Urban Tree Conference at the Morton Arboretum, November 18-19. Registration is now open.

- Peter Gaulke has joined the Southern Region as the new Planning Unit Director.
- The Performance Scorecard summary report will be completed soon.
- The El Yunque, Francis Marion, and Nantahala-Pisgah National Forests will soon develop draft forest plans using vulnerability and carbon information from the assessment phase of the plan revision process.
- <u>Joint Fire Science Program funding opportunities</u> are available (proposals are due soon). The Southern Region is identifying information needs, partners, and researchers.
