### Washington Office Updates (Research and Development)

### Randy Johnson, National Program Leader, Genetics and Global Change Research

- Realignment/reorganization processes at the Washington Office are expected to be completed by the beginning of the next fiscal year.
- The Forest Service Inventory, Monitoring and Assessment group is determining the agency's key management questions. Contact Randy (randyjohnson@fs.fed.us) with ideas for key management questions, needs for corporate data, etc.
- Climate Change Scorecard results are due September 7. The Climate Change Advisor's office continues to develop the Scorecard.
- The Interagency Land Management Adaptation group is discussing review of vulnerability assessments for best management practices.
- Capability mapping for climate change, fire, etc. is ongoing. Discussion includes using the Research Information Tracking System (RITS) to show individuals' contributions.
- The National Climate Assessment will be available soon as a General Technical Report from the Pacific Northwest Research Station.
- The Carbon Cycle Interagency Working Group is developing focus areas and regional assessments. Contact Randy to provide input.
- The National Forest Foundation is deciding the next iteration of the Carbon Capitol Fund. Contact Chris Farley (<a href="mailto:cfarley@fs.fed.us">cfarley@fs.fed.us</a>) for more information.

- A state line meeting next week will involve state forestry agencies and cooperators in Texas and Oklahoma to address issues and information needs resulting from recent drought and fires.
- The southeastern assessment (part of the National Climate Assessment) will be published as a book in early 2013.
- EFETAC staff members are developing brochures for State Foresters based on content derived from the Template for Assessing Climate Change Impacts and Management Options (TACCIMO).

#### **National Forest System Updates**

#### David Meriwether, Ecosystems Management Coordinator, Southern Region

- Region 8 (Southern Region) staff members are focused on forest planning and monitoring needs related to the new Planning Rule and implementation.
- Forest plan revision work is underway for the Francis-Marion National Forest. The El Yunque National Forest (Puerto Rico) is progressing with plan revision with support from partners in FS R&D and the International Institute of Tropical Forestry.
- Hydrology will be the topic for this month's regional science committee meeting. Regional science committee work will be condensed into primers for southern forests.
